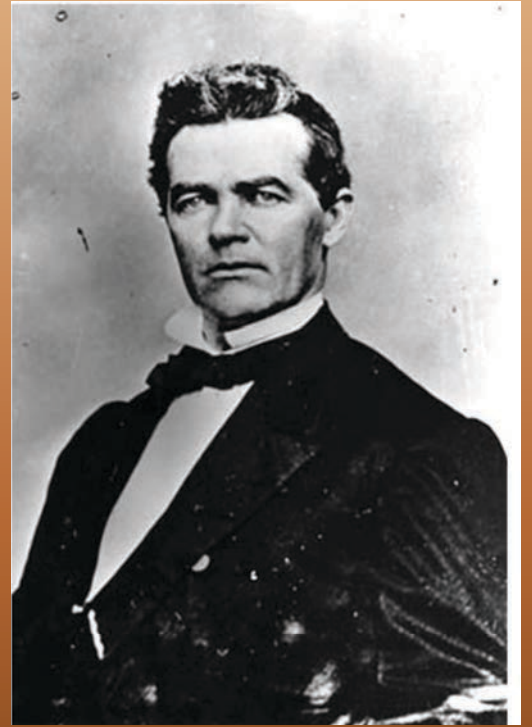


STATE PARKS, A HISTORY









State of California—Executive Department,
 Sacramento, Sept. 28th 1864

Proclamation.

Whereas the United States, by an Act passed at the first Session of the thirty eighth Congress, has granted to this State the territory comprising the "Humboldt Valley" and the "Mariposa Big Tree Grove" to be held and used for the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas it is also provided in the Act, that the management and control of the tract of land shall be committed to a Board of Commissioners, to be appointed by the Governor;

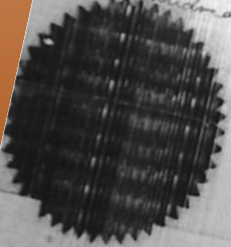
Now therefore be it known that I, Zachary C. Taylor, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the authority in me vested, have appointed Fred Russ Christy, Joseph J. Whitney, William Ashburner, J. W. Raymond, C. S. Collier, Alexander Berry, George W. Coulter, and Galen W. Clark said Commissioners, to whom is confided the management of the aforesaid tract of land, and thereby more ad-

the said territory, and from cutting timber or doing any substantial work within the limits of the said territory.

And propositions for the improvement of the aforesaid tracts of land for leases, should be made to the Commissioners of the Humboldt Valley, Mariposa County.

In witness whereof, I have caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed to this twenty eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty four.

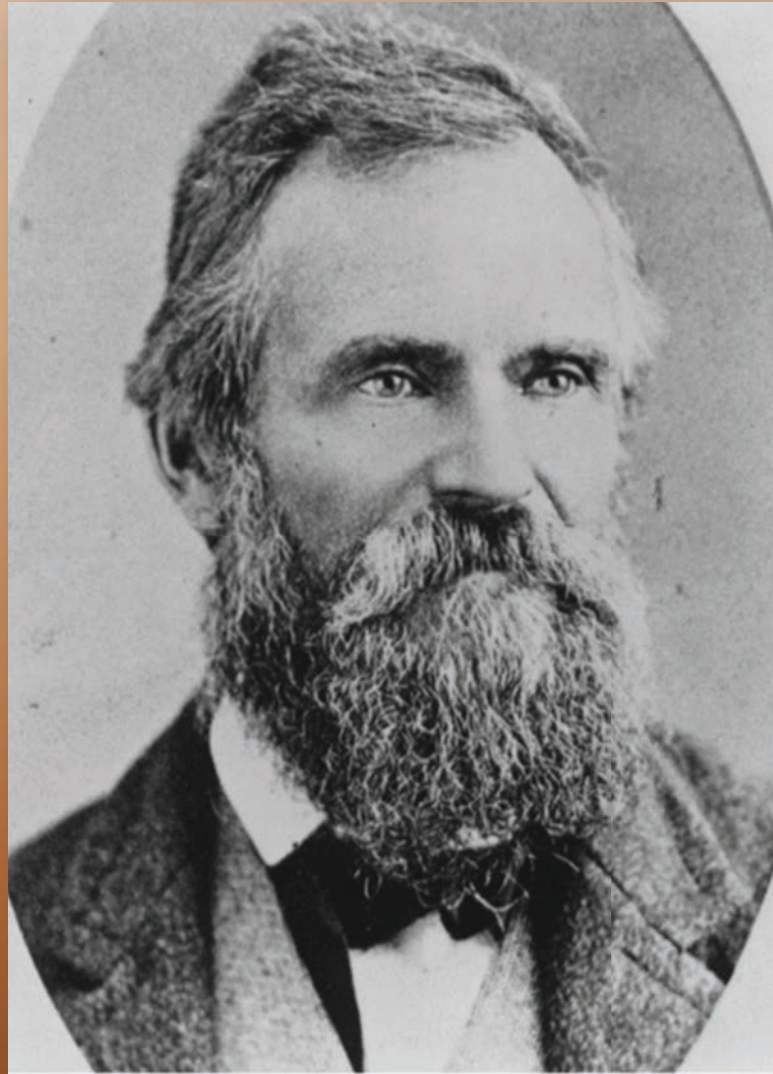


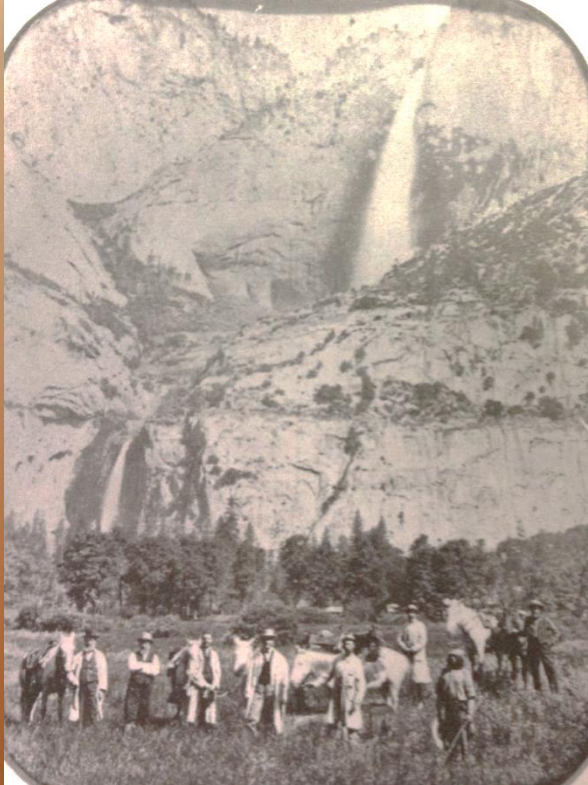

THE STONEMAN HOUSE, YOSEMITE VALLEY,

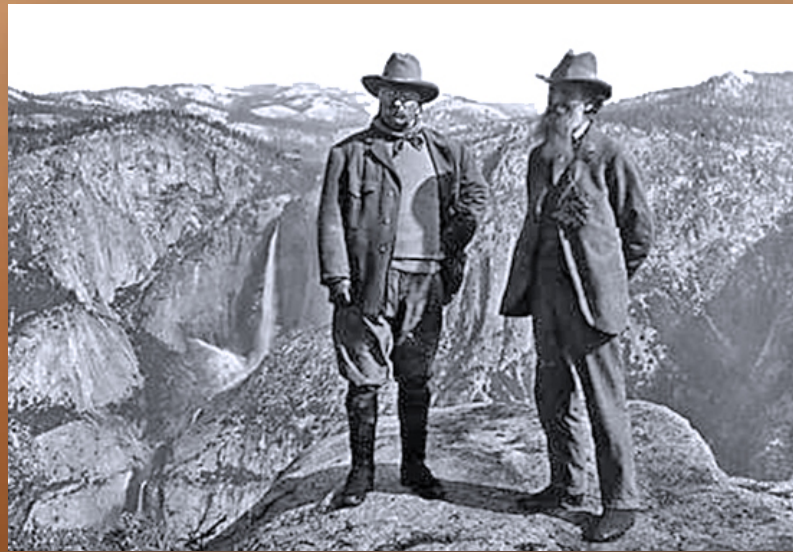
